Musicians

Soloist, Renee Sousa, soprano, has appeared with LA Opera as a Noble Page in Tannhäuser, a Lady Traveler in Manon, a Noble Orphan in Der Rosenkavalier and Kate Pinkerton in Madama Butterfly. She performed Marguerite in Faust with Pacific Repertory Opera in San Luis Obispo. Other operatic roles have included Cio-Cio-San in Madama Butterfly and Micaela in Carmen (Stockton Symphony); Lolette in La Rondine (LA Opera); Mimì in La Bohème (Arizona Opera); Donna Elvira in Don Giovanni (Santa Barbara Grand Opera); Alexandra in Regina (Opera Pacific); and the title role in Susannah.
